MTC wins \$165M bids to operate three additional prisons

Early next year, Utah Company will operate nine correctional facilities in Texas with 10,120 inmate beds

(CENTERVILLE, Utah) – Management & Training Corporation (MTC) was awarded operational contracts for three correctional facilities last week, during a meeting of the Texas Board of Criminal Justice. Starting January 16, 2009, MTC will add the three facilities to six others it currently operates in the Lone Star state. At that time, 10,120 inmate beds will be under MTC management in Texas.

“MTC looks forward to the opportunity to expand its successful programs to more Texas prisons,” said President Scott Marquardt. “Our Corrections division is a leader in providing effective programming and rehabilitation which prepare offenders for successful re-entry into the community. We are pleased the Texas Department of Criminal Justice values this philosophy.”

The Billy Moore (500), Diboll (518) and Estes (1040) Correctional Centers have a combined inmate capacity of 2058. The northeastern Texas facilities will employ 428 correctional officers and other personnel. Most current employees at all three sites are expected to be retained.

The base period for the contracts is January 16, 2009 through August 31, 2011. If the Texas Department of Criminal Justice exercises option periods, MTC could operate the facilities through existing contracts until September 1, 2015. The combined minimum value of the contracts is \$62,615,000. If all options are exercised, the contract values will grow to \$165,778,000.

MTC will now operate a total of 16 correctional facilities in Texas, California, Ohio, Arizona and New Mexico. The total inmate capacity at all 16 sites will be more than 19,000.

Management & Training Corporation is the fifth largest private employer in Utah. In addition to the 16 correctional facilities the company will soon manage, MTC also operates – or partners in the operation of – 25 Job Corps centers across the United States. That number will grow to 26 next month, when MTC begins management of the Earle C. Clements Job Corps Center in Kentucky. Once the three new Texas prisons are completely staffed, MTC will employ more than 8000 people.

In Utah, MTC employees 146 people at its corporate headquarters in Centerville and 347 people at the Clearfield Job Corps Center.
