



Projects “Make a Difference” for Cancer Patients

(CLEARFIELD, Utah) – Clearfield Job Corps students and staff participated in several projects during *National Make a Difference Week*, October 20 - 24, 2008. The activities were designed primarily to benefit cancer patients at two local hospitals.

On Tuesday, October 21 – in the Martin Luther King Jr. Gymnasium at Clearfield Job Corps – 84 students, staff and community members showed up to donate blood to aid in the fight against cancer.

Other projects that benefited Ogden Regional Medical Center included the construction of a custom metal frame to hold an inspirational poem. Manufactured by Clearfield center welding students, the frame now hangs in the waiting room of the Val A. Browning Cancer Treatment Center.

Meanwhile, several Clearfield machining students produced medallions with the same inspirational poem inscribed on them.

Also, business technology students created bookmarks with the poem printed on it, for patients and visiting family members to take home with them.

Culinary Arts students baked cookies and iced them with pink ribbons and the word “Hope” for Breast Cancer Awareness Month as well.



Additionally, the next day – Wednesday, October 22 – some 50 bird houses were delivered to Primary Children’s Medical Center in Salt Lake City. The donated items were delivered by Clearfield Job Corps’ facilities maintenance staff and students, along with the center’s Business and Community Liaison. The birdhouses were donated to provide children undergoing cancer treatment craft activities to paint during their stay at the medical center and to take home afterward.
