MTC bids to expand Kingman prison capacity to 3400 inmates

Success of thriving facility and strong relationship with the community prompts bid to grow site by 2000 beds

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE – January 30, 2008

(CENTERVILLE, Utah) – Management & Training Corporation (MTC) has responded to a request for proposal (RFP) from the Arizona Department of Corrections by submitting a bid to expand the already successful Arizona State Prison – Kingman from its current inmate capacity of 1400 inmates to house a total of 3400 inmates. Growing the facility’s bed count by 2000 would require new construction totaling \$130 to \$150 million. The expanded prison’s annual payroll would exceed \$15 million.

“MTC is very pleased with the opportunity the Arizona Department of Corrections has given us to manage the Kingman facility at its current inmate capacity,” said MTC Sr. Corrections Vice President Odie Washington. “By hiring almost exclusively from the local community we have built a very effective workforce. They are successfully rehabilitating inmates and turning lives around. We would welcome the opportunity to serve an even larger offender population at the current site.”

MTC is confident it has proven itself to the community. The company’s operational track record clearly shows, inmates can be successfully rehabilitated at Industrial Park, with no negative impact to Mohave County. Moreover, MTC provided its ASP - Kingman employees \$9.3-million in salaries and benefits last year. Also, county property taxes were paid in 2007 in the amount of \$295,289. These salaries, benefits and tax payments will undoubtedly grow substantially if the expansion bid is accepted.

“It’s a shame there is a need for any additional prison space in Arizona,” said Mohave County Supervisor Buster Johnson. “But the sad reality is, our state does have a need. If an additional 2000 beds are necessary, I would be very comfortable to see MTC operate them. The company has proven to be a quality corporate neighbor. The prison operators do what they say they’re going to do, support community projects and charities, and manage the facility in a very professional manner.”

The existing 1400-bed Arizona State Prison – Kingman currently contributes Restorative Justice payments to the community in excess of \$300,000 annually, through inmate community service projects and corporate charitable donations. Expanding inmate capacity at the site to 3400 would allow the value of this contribution to grow significantly.

The site of the current facility provides the Arizona Department of Corrections with an ideal expansion opportunity because Industrial Park is already zoned to allow correctional facilities. Additionally, the current location also enjoys the critical water supply necessary to accommodate such an expansion.
