## **MTC soon to operate 11 correctional facilities in Texas**

**Two new contracts and one renewal will give Utah company a larger presence in the Lone Star State**

**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE – June 24, 2010**

**(CENTERVILLE, Utah)** – The Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) has just announced Management & Training Corporation (MTC) as the winning bidder to operate three of its correctional facilities. Each of three separate contracts features a 3-year base period, followed by two, 2-year option periods. If the contracts all run their full seven years, the total value to MTC will be \$135,600,000. The three new contracts each begin September 1, 2010.

“MTC is very pleased to once again be chosen as a preferred facility operator by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice,” said Sr. Corrections Vice President Odie Washington. “We are proud of the success our facilities have in rehabilitating inmates through our *Success for Life* © and *Foundations for Life* © programming. We are honored to be given these additional opportunities to serve Texas taxpayers.”

One of the three prisons – the Kyle Correctional Facility, south of Austin – is familiar to MTC. This operations contract is a renewal. MTC first began managing the Kyle, Texas facility in 2005. New to MTC is the Bridgeport Correctional Center northwest of Forth Worth and the South Texas Intermediate Sanction Facility in downtown Houston. The three TDCJ facilities house minimum and medium security male inmates, with a combined inmate capacity of 1494. The total number of employees at the three prisons will be about 340.

When MTC takes over these contracts in September, the Utah-based company will be managing 20 correctional facilities in Arizona, California, Florida, Idaho, New Mexico, Ohio and Texas. The combined inmate capacity of these 20 facilities is 25,201. Eleven of the 20 facilities are located in Texas.

Additionally, MTC also operates or partners in operating 24 Job Corps centers for the United States Department of Labor. These residential training facilities, located from Massachusetts to Hawaii, have a combined student capacity of more than 12,000 and serve more than 18,000 students annually.

“MTC believes in rehabilitating inmates by providing them with educational opportunities,” Sr. VP Washington added. “For nearly a quarter century we have assisted inmates to improve their lives and to reestablish themselves as successful members of society.”
