Corporate community service project culminates this Saturday

MTC to announce which qualified Job Corps graduate will purchase Ogden home built by volunteers

(CENTERVILLE, Utah) – Founded in January 1981, Management & Training Corporation (MTC) is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year. Utah's fourth largest private employer has chosen '*25 Years of Building Futures*' as its silver anniversary theme.

MTC has spent 25 years changing the lives of hundreds of thousands of young people by operating federal Job Corps employment training centers across the country, including the Clearfield Job Corps Center. MTC also operates 13 correctional facilities in the United States, Canada and Australia. With 650 Utah-based employees and 5615 employees around the world, Management & Training Corporation is fourth on the list of Utah's Top 100 Private Companies in the May 2006 issue of *Utah Business* magazine.

In keeping with the *Building Futures* theme, MTC's primary 25th anniversary undertaking has been to construct a 3 bedroom, 2½ bath home in Ogden. Hundreds of sweat equity hours have been put into the home by MTC employees. Local merchants and vendors have also approximately \$15,000 in supplies.

This Saturday, August 12, 2006, Management & Training Corporation will announce the home's new owners. A corporate committee has reviewed several applications and essays from Job Corps graduates wishing to purchase the home at a significantly-below-market price.

"We are very excited by the interest being shown by people wanting to live in the home," said MTC Government & Community Relations Vice President Celeste McDonald. "Our selection committee has had a very difficult task selecting the home buyer. The essays written by Job Corps graduates are heartwarming."

The new homeowner will be announced during an MTC Corporate picnic at the house this Saturday. As part of the day's celebration – prior to the picnic – MTC staff will carry out volunteer service projects at a variety of Ogden sites. The picnic will then get underway at noon.

Ogden Mayor Matthew Godfrey and MTC President Scott Marquardt will offer brief comments at 1:00 PM, followed by the announcement of the new home owner.

MTC invites the media to attend our 25th anniversary celebration picnic:

- **Who** – will live in this volunteer-constructed home? The announcement will be made at the picnic.
- **What** – A celebration marking the end of the MTC volunteer home construction project.
- **Where** – **745 Cahoon Drive, Ogden.** (East on 24th Street, across Washington Blvd., to Liberty Avenue. Turn left (north) on Liberty, then left again (west) onto Cahoon Drive.
- **When** – **Saturday August 12 – Picnic at noon – homeowner announcement at 1:00 PM.**
- **Why** – MTC observes its 25th anniversary by donating an estimated \$50,000 in new home equity to the Ogden City Community Development Agency and a qualified Job Corps graduate.
- **How** – This donation made possible with thousands of dollars in area merchant donations and hundreds of hours of MTC employee volunteer time.
