Certifications and Education Programs

Residents at the Diboll Correctional Center can earn industry-recognized certifications through a partnership with the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER). NCCER certifications in carpentry and other core construction courses provide residents with the edge to get jobs after they're released. Employment is key to reducing recidivism.
