Certifications and Education Programs

Residents at the Kyle Correctional Center have the opportunity to participate in general education courses including GED preparation to give them the basic academic skills they need to successfully re-enter society. The facility also provides cognitive therapy and addiction recovery programs from organizations like Alcoholics Anonymous and Celebrate Recovery.



Kyle Correctional Center has Achieved Nationally-Recognized Corrections and Safety Accreditations

Kyle Correctional Center is accredited by the American Correctional Association—achieving over 99% compliance for both mandatory and non-mandatory standards in its most recent audit. The facility is also certified by the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA).
