### College Partnerships and Certification Programs

The Arizona State Prison—Marana has partnered with Rio Salado College and Adams State University to provide residents with higher-education courses. The facility also partners with the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) to provide residents with the opportunity to earn industry-recognized certifications.

Arizona State Prison—Marana is accredited by the American Correctional Association, achieving 100% compliance for mandatory standards in its most recent audit.
