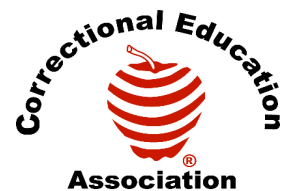
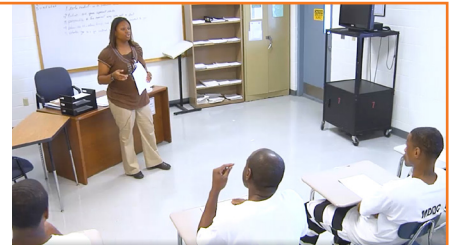
Resident Results

Certifications and Education Programs

Men at the Marshall County Correctional Facility can earn a GED and further advance their academic education through a variety of courses. Residents also have the opportunity to participate in training in culinary arts, barber school, computer technology, and entrepreneurship. Employment after release from prison is key to reducing recidivism.
