RECOVERY, THERAPY, AND **CERTIFICATIONS PROGRAMS**

Residents at the Wilkinson County Correctional Facility can earn a GED and further advance their academic education through a variety of courses. The facility has partnered with Southwest Mississippi Community College to offer a Community College Vocational Certificate. The facility also provides job-readiness classes to help residents with resumes, interviewing, and other job skills. Employment after release from prison is key to reducing recidivism.
