MTC is committed to providing high-quality programming to detainees. MTC has decades of experience providing education and training for disadvantaged populations and takes this wealth of experience to the operation of detention facilities. Programming helps detainees to prepare to transition back into their communities and make the most of their time in detention.

The facility provided 598,544 hours of effective programs, courses, and activities including adult basic education courses in English and Spanish, GED, and vocational training. In addition, the facility has a partnership with Sure Helpline Crisis Center. Counselors from the organization visit the facility regularly to help the residents work through various life challenges. 13 Mexican Consulate-INEA Certifications were earned.

MTC is Committed to Being a Good Neighbor and Investing in the Local Community

Volunteers work hand-in-hand with staff at the Imperial Regional Detention Facility to help the residents in a variety of ways. Religious volunteers provide residents with strength, hope, and encouragement. Other volunteers offer crucial services like the Sure Helpline Crisis Center, which provides counseling and support to residents who have experienced abuse prior to coming to the facility. Representatives from local government, business, and civic organizations serve on the facility's community relations council. Facility leaders share important updates and collaborate on issues important to the community.

Nationally-Recognized Corrections and Safety Accreditations

Imperial Regional Detention Facility is accredited by the American Correctional Association - achieving 99% compliance for both mandatory and non-mandatory standards in its most recent audit. Other accreditations and certifications include the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) and National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC).
