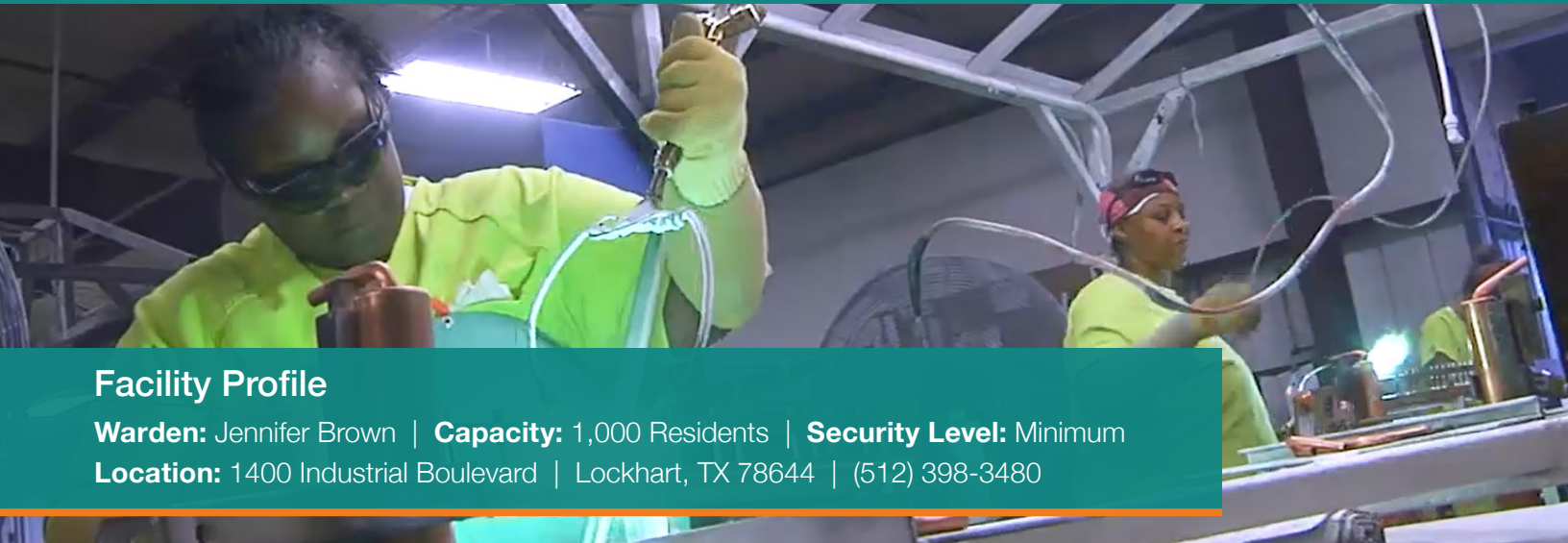

College Partnerships and Certification Programs

Women at the Gregory S. Coleman Unit have unique job training opportunities. Two companies, Henderson Controls which makes HVAC parts and Onshore which makes circuit boards, have set up operations inside the facility. Residents can work inside these shops earning good money and learning valuable job skills that will translate to jobs after they're released. Lockhart residents also take college courses through a partnership with Austin Community College and the University of Texas.



Gregory S. Coleman Unit has Achieved Nationally-Recognized Corrections and Safety Accreditations

Gregory S. Coleman Unit is accredited by the American Correctional Association—achieving over 99% compliance for both mandatory and non-mandatory standards in its most recent audit. The facility is also certified by the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA).
