366 certificates earned in educational, career training, substance abuse treatment, and life-skills programs in the last year.



RECOVERY, THERAPY, AND CERTIFICATIONS PROGRAMS

Residents have unique job training opportunities. Two companies, Henderson Controls, which makes HVAC parts, and Onshore, which makes circuit boards, have set up operations inside the facility. Residents can work inside these shops earning good money and learning valuable job skills that will translate to jobs after they're released. Residents also take college courses through a partnership with Austin Community College and the University of Texas.

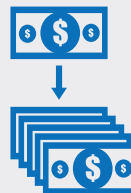
