MTC-HOPE (Helping Other People Every Day) is a transitional treatment center that assists clients who have been recently released from prison. HOPE offers various programs, including intensive and supportive residential services, intensive and supportive outpatient services, and opioid tele-conferencing services.

MTC-HOPE focuses on providing our clients with the tools necessary to successfully re-enter society while remaining in long-term recovery. MTC-HOPE is a new state-of-the-art facility specifically designed and built to maximize and support treatment outcomes.

30, 60, and 90-day treatment programs are available at the HOPE facility. Residents in the 60 or 90-day programs attend treatment and are required to work towards obtaining employment after their first ten days at the facility. Residents in the 30-day program do not obtain employment as the primary focus is on eight hours of treatmentrelated groups and activities Monday through Friday.

Residents consist of men and women on probation and parole. Family visitation runs on the weekends and includes a one-hour family counseling session on Saturdays.

HOPE provides transportation for residents to and from employment in Henderson, TX, as well as medical or other required appointments.
